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**POST BIOPSY CARE INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1) Remove band-aid tonight or tomorrow morning.
- 2) Gently wash the biopsy site with soap and water once a day.
- 3) Pat dry and apply Vaseline or Aquaphor and a band-aid until healed.

Some redness and minimal discomfort is a normal part of the healing process for the first few weeks after the biopsy. It often takes 3-4 weeks for biopsies to heal. The hands, feet, and legs may take longer. The biopsy site will heal with a scar. Please call our office if you have any questions or concerns.
